

**T**he Guardian newspaper was first founded 200 years ago, in 1821. In its first week it reported on revolutions in Naples and Sardinia as well as events in Moldavia, Odessa and Portugal.

**A**lso in July 1821, George IV was crowned King of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland. His estranged wife, Caroline of Brunswick, was turned away from the coronation ceremony. This was the last coronation at which the full ceremony of the King's Champion was carried out, and at which [Dillegroust](#) was served.


